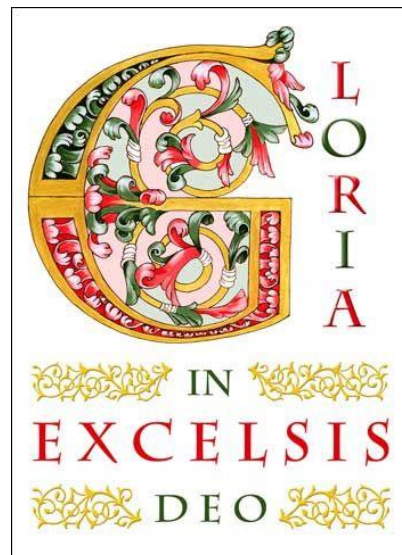

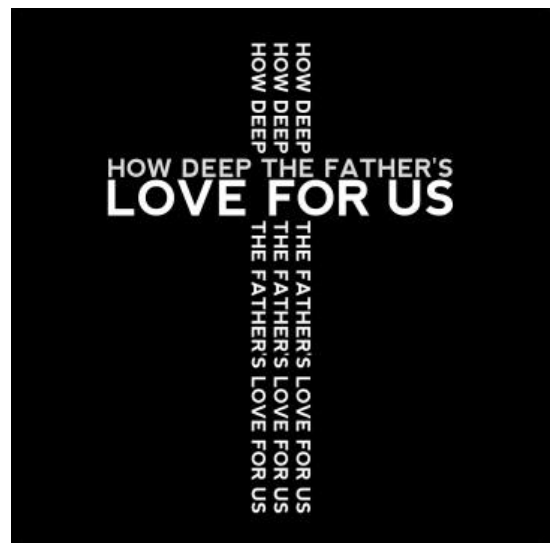
Gradual Hymn
